Design for transformative change: evidence, agency, cross-disciplinary knowledge

We are at crossroads. Our deltas face unprecedented stressors, such as an ever-increasing sea level threat, a major task to renew aging infrastructure, and disruptive transitions. We need to radically change our current delta practice in the Netherlands and beyond. There is still too much emphasis on short-term interventions, while it is more important than ever to collectively build long-term pathways to sustainable and inclusive deltas. Interactions between design, critical design thinking, and cross-disciplinarity studies offer an approach for questioning, understanding and changing socio-ecological relations shaping delta futures.

The conference program will address the current status and future challenges of our deltas, centered on design and design-based approaches to jointly identify these pathways. Convergence Alliance-Resilient Delta, The City of Rotterdam, TU Delft, Deltares, IHE Delft, The Delta Alliance, Wageningen University & Research, the Delta commissioner, and the PBL Netherlands Environmental Assessment Agency will co-host the conference.

We are a community of academia, practitioners and policy makers from across the world building this new approach during the Redesigning Deltas International Conference. This conference is a unique opportunity to inspire change, we hope to co-create these new design-based pathways together.
