Towards a certification and labelling scheme based on the ecosystem services approach

Abstract

Certification and labelling are considered economic instruments with potential for the preservation of ecosystems and biodiversity, since they incorporate sustainability criteria into production chains and allow consumers to make choices of more environmentally friendly products. In fact, several sectors already adopt labels and certification and traceability systems to certify that their products are sustainable. Notwithstanding these advances, there are several issues to be overcome for certification and labelling schemes to effectively achieve their environmental preservation purpose. Greenwashing is perhaps the best example of the problems related to certification and labelling. But also the lack of adequate technical, legal, accounting and economic criteria hinders or denies the achievement of the purpose of environmental labels and certification. This session aims to discuss how the consideration of ecosystem services can contribute to the creation or improvement of certification and labeling schemes.
