

Judy Veldhuijzen

Dr. Judy Veldhuijzen is Associate Professor in the Health, Medical and Neuropsychology Unit at Leiden University, the Netherlands. After obtaining her PhD in 2005 with the title: *'The effects of pain and its pharmacological treatment on driving ability and cognition'* at the pharmacology department of Utrecht University, Judy Veldhuijzen started working as a postdoc at the pain research unit at University of Maryland Baltimore. In 2007, she came started as an Assistant professor working for several years at the Anesthesiology department of the UMC Utrecht. In 2014, she moved to Leiden and started working on placebo and nocebo mechanisms using state of the art techniques including imaging and pharmacological manipulations. Throughout the years, she was supported by several grants and awards (e.g. *EGG grant, ReumaNederland and Diabetesfonds*) for her innovative, interdisciplinary and translational research on psychobiological mechanisms and treatments for health and disease. She is a co-founder of the Interdisciplinary Placebo Studies Center (IPS; founded in 2023) in Leiden which is an excellence center for research on the topics of placebo and nocebo effects and its application in clinical practice.
