

Perspective-taking and interdisciplinary collaboration





What is perspective taking?

Conscious action to put yourself in the shoes of someone else:

- Active process → awareness and motivation
- Associated with less bias and stereotypes
- "Easier" with people with a more similar identity/experiences.

Definition perspective-taking: "To spontaneously adopt the psychological view of others" (Davis 1980)





Perspective-taking vs Empathy






Perspective taking: Dynamic



Narrative Medicine: understand each others' stories

Narrative medicine interventions are designed to help people develop and enrich their **narrative**

competence: "the ability to acknowledge, absorb, interpret and act on the stories and plights of others."
